

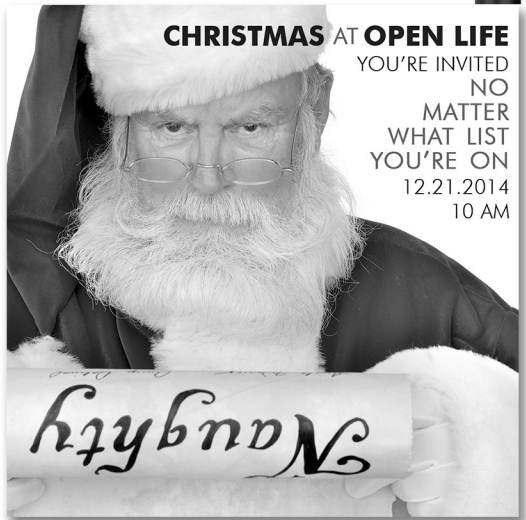
Jadon Haynes | **BUSY BEING** | 11.30.2014
